
Audio Setup Utility

- Tools-Audio-Audio Setup Wizard
- Make sure any external computer speakers are plugged in to the headphone or speaker jack on your computer, plugged into a power source and turned on
- Make sure your computer audio settings are not set to *mute*. Click on the picture of a speaker on the lower right-hand corner of your screen to check this setting.

Click on *Session* on the menu bar above, and choose *Connection Speed*. Choose a slower speed for your connection (higher on the list = slower)

Here, you can type your message.


Messages appear here.

Remember: the moderator can see EVERYTHING you put in the chat box!












Class Connect Tools: Whiteboard Tools




Class Connect Tools: Audio/Video



- Audio Setup Wizard button
- Turn picture / name of person talking on/off.
- Picture / name of person talking
- Microphone volume
- Press to talk.
- Speaker volume

The microphone privilege allows you to speak to the teacher. Only one person can speak at a time.

What will I learn in Kindergarten ELA?



- **Inquiry and Investigation**- Students' natural curiosity is encouraged in all aspects of their learning. It is this "wondering" that promotes the development of critical thinking and problem solving skills later in school and in life.
- **Learning to Read**- Students focus on the written word. They work to recognize the relationship between letters, sounds, and words, and how they give meaning.



What will I learn in Kindergarten ELA?

- **Writing-** Students work to share their ideas on paper using drawings, words, and dictation to describe an event or tell a story. As the year goes by, students begin to use basic punctuation and English grammar.
- **Communication-** Students work on listening to others, explaining their ideas, and responding to the ideas of others. They begin to study different ways to improve their communication skills.



What will I learn in Kindergarten ELA?

- **Reading for Enjoyment and Enrichment-** Students learn to identify and understand the parts of a book and a story, and how those parts influence the meaning.
- **Reading for Information-** Students ask the basic questions: who, what, when, where, why, and how. Now they begin to learn how to gain and apply information and ask further questions.



What will I learn in 1st Grade ELA?

- **Inquiry and Investigation-** Students work to gather information and facts on a topic. They begin to ask the type of questions that encourage critical thinking and problem-solving skills later in school and in life.
- **Learning to Read-** Students continue to work on the relationships of letters and sounds that make up words and how they give meaning. They use the basics of written grammar and work on building clear sentences. These skills help them become strong readers.



What will I learn in 1st Grade ELA?

- **Writing-** Students begin to write and describe events, give opinions, and provide information on a topic. By the end of the year, students will write in complete sentences. Their use of basic English grammar expands.
- **Communication-** Students participate in discussions. They listen to others, present their ideas, and respond to others' comments. They examine how a variety of media present topics in order to improve their communication skills.



What will I learn in 1st Grade ELA?

- **Reading for Enjoyment and Enrichment-** Students learn to think about the purpose of a book and identify the main idea. They retell a story to show understanding and the order of events.
- **Reading for Information-** Students examine the basic questions: who, what, when, where, why, and how. They begin to learn how to gain and apply information, and to draw suggestions and conclusions from text.



What will I learn in 2nd Grade ELA?

- **Inquiry and Investigation-** Students work together to develop questions and gather information. They begin to generate possible explanations and develop alternatives. These abilities serve as the basis for critical thinking and problem-solving skills.
- **Learning to Read-** Students apply the sounds that make up words. Students work on self-correction of their reading. They are challenged to become more fluent readers. The 2nd grade is a pivotal time in reading. Students move beyond looking at the parts of an unfamiliar word to figure it out, and instead now use context clues.






What will I learn in 2nd Grade ELA?

- **Writing-** Students practice writing different types of sentences; improving on how they describe events, give opinions, and provide information on a topic. The students begin learning cursive writing, which helps improve their fine motor skills, thinking, and short-term memory.
- **Communication-** Students' speaking and listening skills are expanding. They exhibit more self-control as they listen to others. 2nd graders improve in the way they explain personal ideas and respond to others' comments. They begin to think about the techniques of oral presentation.



What will I learn in 2nd Grade ELA?

- **Reading for Enjoyment and Enrichment-** Students look more deeply into the outlook, attitude, and points of view in understanding a text. They look at why an author wrote a piece and the manner in which it is written.
- **Reading for Information-** The standards challenge 2nd graders to think about their conclusions and determine whether they need more information in order to make a decision or solve a problem.




Study Hall


